We will begin our tour at the historic Abingdon Church, which was founded Circean 1650. Our next stop will be to the Timberneck House which is located in the Machicomoco State Park. Timberneck was built in the 1790's for the Catlet family.

Susan Kern: The Jeffersons at Shadwell

Join us on Sunday October 8 at the Hennage Auditorium to hear Susan Kern discuss the Jeffersons at Shadwell. Susan Kern is Associate Professor and Director of the Historic Preservation Program at University of Maryland School of Architecture, Planning, and Preservation. She directed field excavations at Shadwell as part of Monticello's efforts to understand Jefferson's boyhood home. Her book, *The Jeffersons at Shadwell* (Yale 2010), details archaeological evidence that reveals how the Jeffersons and the people they enslaved established families and maintained connections across colonial Virginia.
