History Happenings

Have you had a chance to see the new location of The Bray School in Williamsburg? The Bray School is the oldest surviving building in the United States dedicated to the education of black children. It was established in 1760 by an Anglican charity from England named the Associates of Dr. Bray. Ann Wager, a widow from Williamsburg, was the only instructor during the years the school was open, serving over 300 students between 1760 and 1774.

On Friday, February 10, 2023 the Bray School was relocated from its location on William and

Mary's campus to its new home on the corner of Francis and Nassau streets in the historic area. It is CW's 89th original structure.

Research is underway and the building will undergo restoration over the next 1.5 years. It is set to open to the public in 2024 to commemorate the 250th anniversary of its closing.
